## Inter-state trafficking - Condemnation and Concerns - An Appeal

We, the undersigned, are horrified by the news of 15<sup>th</sup> May 2024, about sex trafficking of young women and minor girls from Assam into Arunachal Pradesh and the extreme bodily harm they have been subjected to. Young women and minor girls from various districts of Assam have been trafficked into Arunachal Pradesh and forced to perform sexual acts before the camera. The girls were tortured, burnt with cigarettes if they resisted. Some were administered contraceptive pills. This ghastly story of sexual violence, torture and bondage was revealed when one of them escaped and reported it to the public.

Equally horrifying is the identity of the culprits. No other than police personnel in Arunachal, Pradesh ranging from the level of a Deputy Superintendent of Police to constables, officials of government departments like the PWD, Rural Works Department (RWD), and individuals from the medical fraternity, apart from hotel owners and middlemen who facilitate the 'supply' of girls from Assam, are alleged to being involved in this heinous crime. All this has been covered in the print media and TV channels in both Arunachal Pradesh (NEWSFY) and Northeast News Assam. It has been reported that this inter-state trafficking racket, busted by the Itanagar police, has been going on for several years. The TV channels have reported that a total of 22 people had been arrested for their involvement in the sex trade.

Though the perpetrators are in judicial custody, there are multiple challenges and complications involved in ensuring that the aggrieved young girls receive the justice due to them. Some of the minors have reportedly stopped talking, due to their state of shock or trauma. Some survivors have turned hostile because of threats by their own fathers or others involved. Further, we are shocked to know from the news channel NEWSFY that Arunachal's State Commission for the Protection of Child Rights was in the know but took no action.

We, as individuals and representatives of civil society organisations, condemn these heinous criminal activities of the perpetrators in the strongest terms. No words can describe the devilish crimes committed on the young girls and women who, in this case, are reportedly from Assam like Dhemaji, Karbi Anglong and Nagaon. More importantly we must understand and think about the nature of deterioration in the social and economic reality of our society which is pushing our children into the hands of these criminals.

We therefore call on State agencies of both the states to display robust measures toward

eradicating organised sexual crimes against girls and women. Partnerships or collaborative exercises are strongly recommended between state institutions dealing with the enforcement authorities, women's groups and child rights protection. Institutional care homes and One Stop Centres must be included to strengthen this effort to complement the task of sexual crime eradication. We are aware of the success stories of inter-state police coordination in dealing with trafficking and expect this to be taken with full might.

We recommend interventions such as psycho-social care and counselling for those survivors of violence. Social organizations should be considered to conduct workshops that involved positive interaction, music and dance therapy – to enable them to cope with the trauma. Where necessary, special residential facilities with institutional services on counselling, trauma management should be made possible through creative methods, as well as life skills to enable socio-legal and economic support.

We demand that the arrested culprits, and those yet to be caught, are dealt with strict legal action against them under the relevant Acts that are in place. We express our solidarity with the survivors of these recent sexual atrocities who are now under protection, and demand prompt and appropriate action towards the delivery of justice from the judiciary and law enforcement authorities.

It is in this light that we call for wider publicity and collectively condemn these acts of abduction, purchase of vulnerable women and girls from Assam into Arunachal Pradesh, resulting in violence, rape, pornographic voyeurism and bodily harm to them.
