The Journey So Far...

Gender-based violence (GBV) against women and girls is one of the most pressing global emergencies significant and a sustainable challenge to development. Assam is no exception, as GBV remains a widespread issue throughout the state. While home and family are often regarded as the safest spaces for women and girls, the National Crime Records Bureau's (NCRB) "Crime in India Report, 2021"

indicates that most crimes against women in Assam were reported under the category of "Cruelty by Husband or Relatives."[1] Furthermore, National Family Health Survey 2019-21 (NFHS-5) data reveals that 32% of evermarried women aged 18-49 years have experienced spousal violence, and 8% of young women aged 18-29 faced sexual violence by the age of 18 in Assam.[2] According to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) index released by NITI Aayog in June 2021, Assam ranks as the worst performer in achieving gender equality. The 2022 NCRB report noted a 50% decrease in crimes against women in Assam over the last five years, with police attributing this decline to better investigative practices leading to arrests. However, Assam also recorded the second-lowest conviction rate (4.8%) for crimes against women in the country, and it ranked fourth lowest cybercrime convictions and sixth lowest against children. crimes discrepancies in the data highlight significant challenges in the judicial process and the quality of investigations. Despite stricter legal amendments, GBV remains a serious concern, requiring
