Ri-Saw Kun Festival - Celebrating Women Led Eco-Tourism: Meghalaya



NEN hosted a two-day workshop in Guwahati, bringing together 39 participants from Assam, Meghalaya, and Nagaland. Led by Persis Sidhva, Advocate at the Bombay High Court and Director of RATI Foundation for Social Change, the sessions unpacked the implications of India's new criminal laws on survivors of gender-based violence. The workshop equipped participants with critical knowledge and tools, strengthening their capacity to support and advocate for women's rights and justice.

In its 16th year, NEN's Biodiversity Festival at Chizami, Nagaland, brought together around 480 participants. NEN's journey in Nagaland began with a focus on health, and this year's festival explored the deep connections of health with biodiversity, local food systems, and indigenous knowledge, while celebrating 30 years of NEN. Highlights include the inauguration of the Food Sovereignty Cradle, a community seed exchange, a miniature model-making competition, a booklet launch, and a community potluck.
