Frisbee for All: Workshop for Mirdan Youth Collective, Assam



35 members of the Mirdan Youth Collective from Darrang, Dhemaji, Golaghat, Kamrup (R), and Udalguri districts came together for an inspiring workshop that used Ultimate Frisbee as a tool to challenge gender norms and promote equal participation. As an inclusive, non-contact and team-based sport, Ultimate Frisbee provided the perfect platform for learning and growth. Facilitated by resource persons from the ant, the sessions offered a safe space where young girls and boys could play, learn, and engage on equal footing nurturing values of teamwork, respect and leadership both on and off the field.

Raising Dialogue for a Gender-Just Future in Meghalaya



In May 2025, NEN organised a series of interface meetings across East Khasi Hills, Eastern West Khasi Hills, and West Khasi Hills, engaging around 60 key stakeholders including village headmen, ASHAs, Anganwadi workers, women's groups, and community members. These conversations focused on gender equality, gender-based violence, and legal remedies; with an aim to strengthen the support system for survivors of gender-based violence through collective efforts.

NEN Farm School (NFS): Sowing Seeds in 7 Districts of Nagaland



As NFS expands, we move from district to district shaping a meaningful learning journey grounded in agroecology and community food systems. In collaboration with 7 partner organisations from the districts of Tseminyu, Peren, Longleng, Tuensang, Noklak, Shamator, and Kiphire, around 130 participants came together for shared learning and collective action. This initiative has equipped participants to lead locally-driven change and take steps toward strengthening community-based food systems.

World Environment Day 2025

Restore Nature for a Greener Tomorrow

This World Environment Day, NEN has brought together women, youth, partners and communities to raise awareness about restoring ecological balance and to inspire collective action toward a greener, more resilient planet.



ASSAM

160 participants from 6 districts gathered online to reflect on local instances of environmental degradation through interactive discussions, film screenings, and the release of zines.

MEGHALAYA

140 participants, including youth, farmers, and students, engaged in tree plantations and environmental awareness activities across 3 districts.





NAGALAND

369 participants from 5 districts undertook community-led initiatives - from marathons and plantation drives to plastic pollution awareness programmes and cleanliness drives.




